Spirit Refreshers

January 1

The gift of God is that you have been saved through faith. Neither this faith nor this salvation is owing to any works you ever did, will, or can do.

January 2

Grace is the source, faith the condition of salvation; and both are gifts of His bountiful love.



January 3

So that we fall not short of the grace of God,
we need carefully to inquire what is that
faith through which we are saved.

January 4

The faith through which we are saved is, first, a faith in Christ. Christ and God through Christ are the proper objects of it, by which it is absolutely distinguished from the faith of ancient or modern heathens.

January 5


All His people, or as elsewhere expressed, “all that believe in Him,” He saves from all their sins; from original and actual, past and present sin.

January 6

All who are partakers of the salvation
which is by this faith are saved from
the guilt of all past sin.

January 7

Being saved from guilt, those who are partakers of this salvation by faith are saved from fear. . .fear of the wrath of God, whom they no longer regard as a severe Master but as an indulgent Father.



January 8

Thus, one who is born of God “does not sin”—
and though one cannot say he has not sinned,
yet now he does not sin.

January 9

Justification implies a deliverance from guilt and punishment by the atonement of Christ actually applied to the soul of the sinner who is now believing on Him.

January 10

Is the salvation, the justification, that comes by faith against holiness and good works? It would be so, if we spoke. . .of a faith separate from these. But we speak of a faith that is productive of all good works and of all holiness.
